Chocó: a biodiverse paradise

Is one of the 32 departments of Colombia.

Located in the west coast of the country and is one of the most biodiverse areas of the world.

Because of it's location the department is bordered with rainforest, after the Cherranpunji area in India, Chocó is the place with most rainfall in the world.

Water is Chocó's major resource with more than 20 rivers (Atrato, San Juan, Baudo and other 16 rivers).

The temperature, thanks to its geography and humidity conditions, is regularly around 27 Celsius degrees.






Chocó is one of the richest regions of the country, has a big recognition for its natural resources that had being a form of economic development for the locals.

The population cultivates plantain, rice, corn, coconut and cocoa. Also, fishing is one of the most common economic activities.

Besides timber exploitation, mining is another economic activity that had help the population sustain their everyday life, the department is well known for the metals that can be found in its territory (silver, gold, platinum).

Due to the importance of mining as an economic activity there is a lot of academic research in the department about the sustainable use of natural resources (such as timber) and the impact of large scale mining.
